REPORT FROM LAST WEEK'S CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING (PCC) - Our main items were: 1. St. Mary's Balcony project: We've nearly got permission from the Diocese to alter the balcony. We are seeking quotations for the work and when we have them we will launch an appeal for funds and apply for grants. 2. All Saints Window repairs – we are nearly ready to seek permission from the Diocese for the work. To complete the work will cost around £16000 we already have raised a considerable amount towards this and will soon be applying for grants. 3. PCC Elections: Vice Chair Jonathan Dossetor, Secretary Laurence Morlaas, Treasurer Glenis Lee, Electoral Roll Officer Laura Hawksworth. 4. Annual Meeting review: We agreed to shorten the event next year by not having a Communion service in the village hall first. We will re-introduce the Annual Reports and make them available well before the meeting. 5. Money: Income is fairly static, we are hoping to introduce text giving soon and have a parish funding weekend and gift day in mind for Autumn.
