Our CAP Debt Centre continues to operate in King's Lynn despite the lockdown! Emily Hart, our Centre Manager, is currently working from home and doing her casework over the phone and online. This isn't easy, as the face to face meetings she would normally have with clients are by far the most effective way to get things done. But Emily is adapting fast and finding creative ways to serve some of the most vulnerable households in the area.

Centrally CAP Head Office in Bradford, where all the Caseworkers and Specialist Advisors are normally based, have quickly moved to a home-working setup in which only those that absolutely have to be in the office are there and everyone else is working remotely. So the essential work of CAP continues! This is obviously a huge challenge, not least because of the additional pressure that the lockdown is having on households already struggling with debt. But the faith and determination within the organisation, to see lives transformed by Jesus' relentless compassion, is as strong as ever.
